

Recently I was able to finally visit a museum that I've passed many times on the way to Philadelphia. It is dedicated to helicopters and particularly to their development by East coast manufacturers in the DelawareValley. It has several very nice displays detailing the history of Rotary Wing development and its pioneers such as Igor Sikorsky, Stanley Hiller, Frank Piasecki, Lawrence LePage, Arthur Young and others. Along with the history, are many fine exhibits of actual helicopters. This is a real gem of a museum and it's well worth a stop whatever level of interest you may have in helicopters.

### All Manner of Flight

Directly on the heels of Sikorky's successful VS-300, other U.S. helicopter pioneers made their marks on the nathon's helicopter bentage. There was little agreement among early developers on what would make a successful helicopter. Frank Piasecki and fellow engineering sudents from the University of Pierresylvania organized the P-V Forum and designed and flew the P-V-2, the second practical helicopter in the U.S. Two years later in 1945, Piasecki demonstrated the NHRP-X would's first successful trandem notor helicopter. Anhar Young to Paoli, Pennsylvania had worked for more than a decade with remote corton mode's below joining the Bell Aircraft Company in 1941. A year and a half later, Young built be Bell Model 30 or Genevieve as it was christened in December 1942, the third successful U.S. helicopter.

In 1944, Stanley Hiller demonstrated his XH-44, the first successful coastal belicopter in the U.S. with contra-rotating, two-bladed rotors. Lates that year, Kellett, the Gomerating in manufacturer, flew the XR-8, a prototype of a two-seat helicopter with the first of its kind in the U.S. As early as the mid-1940s some forward-direking helicopter pioneses were experimenting with ill-rotor designs. Laurence Leifage and his associates suggested a craft that takes off libe a helicopter, then tilling its rotors to operate designs. Laurence two gas in he saggested a craft that takes off like a belicepter, then tilling its rotors to operate as propellers. The Transcenderad Aircraft Compony exeminally flew the world's first fill-rotor, the TR-TG in 1954. Several years later, The Vertod Aircraft Corporation flew the world's first fill-wing, the VZ-Z. By the 1950s various forms of helicopters were in use for commerce and defense. The helicopter had come of age.
