Mike Knowski: Several new builds. First is Airfix's FW-190F-8 in 1/72 scale. This is completely OOB and was a pleasure to build. Next is a Fine Molds ME-109K in 1/72, with aftermarket decals. Then there is an older diorama I made. It's the Dragon Panzer III in 1/35 scale. Figures are from Masterbox and Miniart. Finally, there is a the 90mm French Mameluke from Pegaso. I painted him with a combination of Vallejo acrylics and oils.



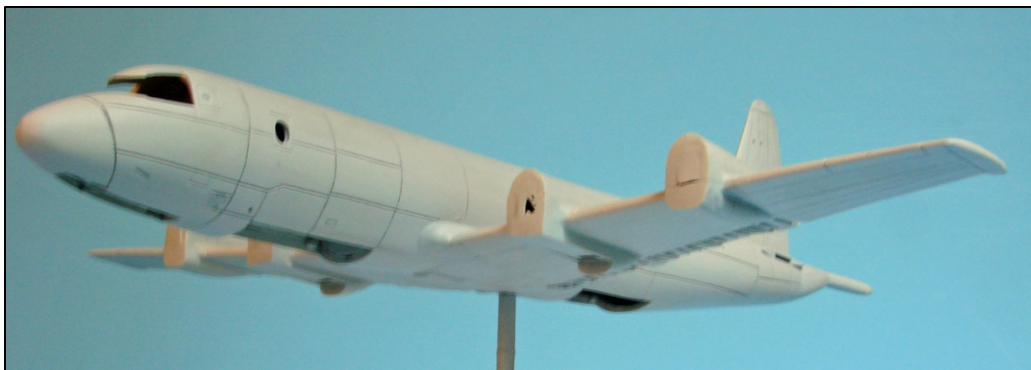
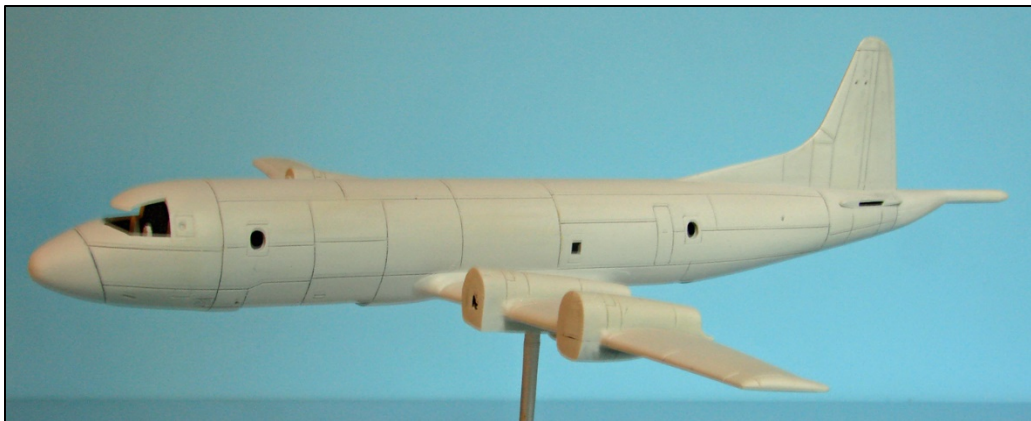
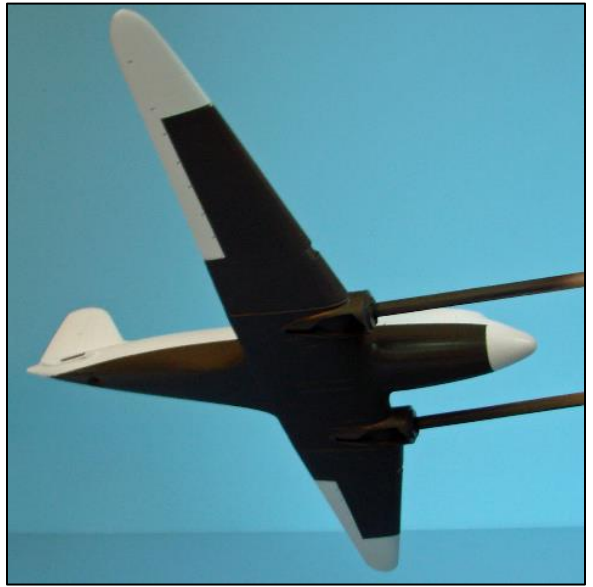


Dick Beemer: I sent this to one of the guys for the newsletter earlier in the year, but it never appeared in the letter (*Ed. note: Sorry about that!*). So here it is for discussion. All I can say is that the aircraft is from Revell but can't find the instructions for the resin radio controlled gliding torpedo. This configuration is in one of my reference books for the Arado 234 C though they admit it may have only be a paper study.



Carl Knable: First, an 1/72nd Airfix F2H-2 Banshee primed with some follow up filler. Not sure of the final scheme yet - either gloss sea blue, or white with red trim. Next is a Minicraft 1/144th C-47. Olive drab and white, awaiting decals. This is a model of an aircraft I photographed in the spring of 1968 while stationed at Warren AFB in Cheyenne, Wyoming (photos included). And finally, an ARII/LS 1/144th P-3C: Scratch-built props, and primed and ready for a topcoat - waiting to get decals printed in order to match colors.





Frank: Hope you guys are doing ok. Attached is the picture of my latest completion. This is the Abrams M1A1 SEP in 1/16th scale (*Ed. Note: Classic Frank – Go Big or Not at All!*). This tank is named The Buffalo Beast. I bought the model at the AMPS National Show in Buffalo. It is a Trumpeter Kit with added bed rolls and tarps. The base is a wood edge piece from Menards. I added Vallejo ground cover and some washes into it. The decals are a custom job I had done. The writing on the barrel, and in the front panels, it is a Buffalo with steam coming out of his nose, which is a University of Buffalo mascot. A fun build that is a big model.



Bill Vinikour - Nearing completion on the Cthulhu model. Cthulhu figure is based on the H.P. Lovecraft's "Call of the Cthulhu." This solid resin model, produced by Hiroto Tsubouchi, stands almost 20" tall. After I finally painted thousands of individual "stones" that comprised its skin texture, I have now attached the wings. The model is essentially done other than some paint and wash touchups (one wing also requires some seam filling where it attaches to the body). As no scale is provided, you can decide on the scale yourself. I am still debating on the diorama that I will use for the model. I am leaning towards a forested cliff scene that will use either 1/87 (HO scale) or 1/48 (O scale) figures, which would make the Cthulhu about 80 to 160 scale feet tall!

F-5 Triple Tiger - Part 1

History

The Northrop F-5 started life as a company project in the mid 1950's, under the designation N-156. USAF interest in the project led to the spin off T-38 Talon. First flights of the N-156 and the T-38 took place in 1959, and first deliveries of the T-38 to the USAF took place in 1961. Meanwhile, the USAF placed orders for the N-156 (now designated F-5A) took place in 1962. In conjunction, a two-seat version of the F-5A (F-5B) was also ordered and delivered. Although the Air Force did not pursue the F-5A/B (USAF aircraft were transferred to the South Vietnamese Air Force in 1967), many other countries went on to purchase and/or produce the F-5A/B. The Air Force did however go on to purchase nearly 1,200 T-38's, most of which are still flying today.

The next chapter in the F-5 story, starts in the late 1960's, with another Northrop private venture to improve the F-5A. The improved F-5, which went on to be designated F-5E, first flew in 1969, and was the subject of some political controversy with regard to which aircraft would be chosen for the U.S. military aid program. After a competition with the LTV F-8, the McDonnell F-4, and Lockheed F-104, the F-5E was selected. A two-seat version, the F-5F was also produced, with over 1000 examples of the F-5E/F being produced and supplied to over fourteen nations. In addition, the F-5E/F went on to become the mainstay of both the USAF and USN aggressor squadrons.

The final chapter in the "Tiger" story involves another Northrop private venture to improve the F-5. In 1975, the F-5E was redesigned to incorporate a single, more powerful F404 engine in the fighter. This version, designated the F-20, was tested and demonstrated, but never put into production.

Modeling the F-5/T-38.

Models of these Northrop aircraft are available in all scales, from 1/144th to 1/32nd. In 1/72nd scale the following models are available:

F-5A - Airfix, ESCI/AMT

F-5B – ESCI/AMT, Hasegawa*

F-5E – Airfix, Testors/Italeri

F-5F – Testors/Italeri

F-20 – Hasegawa

T-38 – Sword

*Note that Hasegawa also boxed this kit as a T-38, however it was still the F-5B, and to make a T-38, several modifications have to take place. These modifications were covered in a 1976 article on the T-38 in an IPMS Quarterly (Vol. 12, No. 1).



Decal Sheets for the F-5:

Having collected all of the above kits over the year, in January 2008, I decided to build a model of each version – F-5A/B/E/F, F-20, and T-38. This article (part 1) will cover building the F-5A, F-5E, and the F-5F. Part 2 will cover the F-5B, F-20 and the T-38.

Since there are so many great aggressor schemes for the F-5, the A, E, and F would be completed that way. The Internet provided a nice Canadian scheme for the F-5A (CF-5A) and a beautiful Navy “Sundowner” scheme for the F-5F, while the USAF scheme for the F-5E came from an old Microscale decal sheet. Lots of good reference material is available on the F-5/T-38 series, including the following:



Construction

In order to simplify and speed up the building process, all three kits were built “gear up” and put on stands. In terms of quality, the Airfix and Testors/Italeri kits had raised panel lines, while those on the ESCI kit were beautifully recessed. The building plan was to construct and paint all three kits simultaneously. This plan was followed up through the priming phase, and then the focus shifted to an individual kit through completion – the CF-5A first, then the F-5E, and finally the F-5F.

Photo 1 - Construction of all three aircraft started at the same time. This photo shows the completed fuselages of the F, the E, and the A (from left to right). Note that the wings are molded as part of the fuselage on the F, while the ESCI (A) and Airfix (E) kits had separate wings.



Photo 2 – The intake splitter plates on the Italeri F-5F kit need to be reshaped. The kit splitters are angle to the rear at the top. They should be slightly angled to the rear at the bottom. Yellow tape has been wrapped around the fuselage to prevent marring while filing the splitters.



Photo 3 – Fuselages have been marked up to highlight where panel lines will be scribed. Note that the ESCI F-5A (bottom of the photo) has scribed panels, but the blue markings show which panel lines will be enhanced. Note that I have removed the wing tip launch rails from the E and the F (using a UMM razor saw). This was done because these parts are delicate and undoubtedly would have been broken off somewhere in the construction process. It was much easier to reattach them at the end of the build.



Photos 4 and 5 - Scribing using the UMM razor saw. The existing raised panel lines are used as the saw guide on the F-5E and F-5F; while the existing recessed lines of the F-5A are cut a little deeper.

Photos 6 and 7 - Models are sanded (removing any raised panel lines), and then buffed with “0000” grade steel wool. The steel wool tends to smooth out any small imperfections in the recessed panel lines.

Photos 8 and 9 - The three models after the first coat of primer/sealer, and after the second coat of straight gray primer. Note that in photo 9, the gray primer has already been sanded and buffed out, thus the glossy appearance.

From this point forward, the models were finished in sequence – first the CF-5A, then the F-5E, and finally the F-5F.

Canadian CF-5A Painting, Decals, and Details

Photo 10 – CF-5A after the base light gray (FS-36307) camouflage color airbrushed. Note that the color was mixed to the FS number and then lightened with white paint. Also note that taping (narrow strips of 3M electrical tape) has begun in preparation for airbrushing the second camouflage color (medium gray – FS36251).
