September 2021 Meeting Recap and Other News

President John Novak brought the meeting to order. There were 17 people in attendance. John discussed the Armor Modeling & Preservation Society (AMPS) Super Regional Show he attended in South Bend, IN, this past August. There were a lot of real military vehicles to view. He mentioned that dealer tables were expensive, so there were mostly high-end model kits with few bargains to be found. In addition to models, there were lots of tools and other modeling supplies for sale. John mentioned that a representative for AK Interactive may give demonstrations at our November Show. We will compensate him with free tables if he comes to our show. The Sept 18, NIMCON 9 Region 5 Convention will be held at Crystal Lake, IL on September 18, while the 1st Great Lakes Challenge Model Contest (a new show) will be held on October 2 at Grand Rapids, MI.

Hector Colon mentioned that he paid the next two installments of our costs for use of the DuPage County Fairgrounds for our November Show, the final payment will be paid soon. Payment has also been made for medals. About 50 dealer tables have been sold to date. He highly recommends that the pre-printed form for model entrees be used. The form can be found on our website.

Show and tell then took place. Following that, Omer Houston held a discussion on judging. He suggested that we have two-man judging teams rather three-man teams that we have used in the past. In most cases of dispute between the two judges, the more experienced judge on the team will have the final word, although Omer can weigh in if a conflict between the two judges cannot be reached. A sign-up sheet was passed around to sign up for judging. Hector mentioned that judges will receive a free lunch, tee shirt, and flashlight.
























CREATING A BASE FOR THE CTHULHU – PART TWO Bill Vinikour

In the April 2021 Newsletter, I covered the initial basing for the Cthulhu model. The next phase of the base involved adding additional sizes of lava rocks to the water areas. This was followed by adding fine reddish sand and reddish dirt that contained small stones. Ground-up and pulverized lava rocks were also added near the shoreline areas. Everything was cemented in place with diluted white glue. Some areas were also cemented in place using and AK Interactive's Gravel & Sand Fixer. Figure 1 shows the results up to this point.



It was then on to detailing the base. In the water areas, I added seashells and starfish (the starfish

that would be underwater were painted various colors based on online photos while those washed ashore were left the dried color), metal fish and crabs, pieces of sponges, barnacles (made from etched brass chestnut leaves that were painted grayish-white and rolled into shape – over 200 added), seagrasses and seaweed (using items from AMSI, Timber Products, Woodland Scenics, and etched brass willow leaves), and pieces of sea fans. Seaweed washed ashore was made from cotton teased apart in a white glue and green paint mixture. Distressed shells were added along the shoreline area to represent shells washed up by the tide or storms. Several pieces of strip wood, distressed and painted, were added to indicate wood from a shipwreck that washed ashore (portions of S.S. Minnow lettering were added to the boards, as were 1/12 scale nails). A rusted anchor and chain were also added, as were two resin barrels and a crate. Figures 2 and 3 show some of these details.





In the upland area, additional dirt and pulverized lava rocks were added. Island vegetation was made from painted plastic plants, sea fans with paper leaves, pieces of SuperTrees (sea foam) with Super Leaves, and badger fur for tall weeds (Figure 4). (Note: unpainted white areas are where the Cthulhu will stand.) A few tidal pools will also be included in the upland area.

Several shells and starfish have been added to these areas (Figure 5). Two rats from a Nosferatu action figure set, detailed with faux fur, were added to the land portion of the base.

The square resin base and a stake (wood skewer) were painted to simulate a rusted iron altar. Pieces of real rusted metal flakes were added for detail. The rotted corpse is part of Glencoe's Neanderthal man skeleton – only the upper half of the skeleton was used to match the male torso victim that will be in Cthulhu's hand. Pieces of bones were selectively cut from the skeleton. Vallejo light brown thick mud was dabbed on the skeleton prior to painting. The dried skin was made with single ply toilet paper dipped in a burnt umber/white glue mixture. Faux fur was used to simulate hair. A few spare bones were similarly detailed and added by the altar (Figure 6).



Part 3 will entail creating the water effects – stay tuned!
