May's Show-and-Tell: Sc-Fi, Horror, and Fantasy



Mike Ferguson: A 1/25 1956 Chevy Nomad from. Revell.









John Bishop: The start of. BIG project – a 1/200 BB-63 USS Missouri. John brought the hull as well as a small handful of his references.






Kevin Stover: Recently obtained 1/350 USS Monson, Dragon.

Among the art tools I have found handy for my modeling are clay shaping tools. These include silicon-tipped shaping tools (good for sculpting material used for filling seams or even painting details) and metal-tipped tools (I use the small round tools for adding paint dots - like on the snail shell in the photo or on the "salamander" I brought in for show and tell). These tools are available on Amazon or at craft stores such as Hobby Lobby. The Master's Touch set can be found in the art section of the store, while the set that has both silicon- and metal-tipped tools can be found in the clay section of the store. The dual set is only about \$5!



Modeling With the Next Generation

As many of you know, I am a huge fan of all the scale modeling podcast shows. These shows are all entertaining and informative. So, if you are not listening to these shows...Why not? Well, podcasts are not the topic of this article: however, all of these shows inevitably ask the same two questions: Is our hobby dying? Where do you see our hobby in the next 5 or 10 years? These questions always make me think of how I would answer them. So, with that in mind, here is what I think. Is our hobby dying? No, I do not think so. Our hobby is NOT dying but changing and evolving.

When I got deeply involved in model building, I was in junior high school. My choices for aircraft kits were pretty much limited to either Revell or Monogram. If I wanted to build a car model, then I had a choice of either AMT or MPC. My choices for paint, outside of Krylon spray cans, was either Testors enamels in the square bottles or Polly S water-based acrylics. As for adhesives, it was one choice split into two -Testors Model cement in either the regular formula (orange tube) or non-toxic in the blue one. I do not know about the rest of you, but the fumes coming from that orange tube has killed more of my brain cells than every adult beverage I've ever consumed COMBINED. But today, we have numerous companies producing high quality kits in plastic and resin with an almost endless supply of aftermarket detail

sets in resin, brass and vinyl. With even more entering the market within the last decade – Kotare, Great Wall, Panda and Eduard just to name a few. Also, with 3D printers becoming much more prevalent on work benches, the sky is the only limit for our hobby.

This discussion always comes to the forefront when looking at the average age of the participant in any model show and even our own club. Let us face facts here, the average age of our club membership has to be somewhere between mid to late fifties. So as our hobby is evolving, model clubs need to evolve as well and expand from just military subjects to subjects that draw the attention of the younger generation. Let us face it, today's generation is not interested in Spitfires, Panzers and the only Mustangs they know of are the ones with eight cylinders, four tires and one horse on the grill. Their interests are more in video games, anime and Sci-Fi. They probably couldn't tell you much about the Pacific War but could dissect in minute detail the movie Pacific *Rim* with their Kaiju and Jaegers (at least the first movie as the sequel is horrendously unwatchable). That is two hours of my life that I will never get back. Oh well, at least the movie was NOT directed by James Cameron because then it would have been three hours of my life that I would never get back.

Recently, I was given a great opportunity to show the next generation our hobby. You see my six-year-old granddaughter was spending the weekend with grandma and grandpa. Now she is very artistic and loves doing crafts. She would rather sit at the table making bath bombs or slime than watching television. Naturally, she asked me if we could do a craft together. Unfortunately, Grandpa is not the glitter, glue, cotton balls and popsicle stick type. Instead, I went through my stash and found the Bandai *Razor Crest* from *The Mandalorian Star Wars* television show.



Now anyone who has built one of these Bandai Snap together kits knows that they are fantastic kits for new model builders. The engineering of these kits is top notch, the detail is amazing, and they go together with very little effort. So, I grabbed the kit, my sprue cutter, a couple of sanding sticks and off we went to the land of our imagination without ever leaving the comfort of the dining room table. During the next forty-five minutes or so, even though she does have trouble focusing on any given task – squirrel!!! She surprised me with her patience and focus. I only had to show her once how to use the sprue cutters. Now she did need help in following the kit instructions and more than once I had to tell her to flip the part over as she was trying to squeeze two parts together and one was the wrong way. All I really had

to do was tell her to match the shapes. This is a testimony to the wonderful engineering of the Bandai kits. But, when she started the engines and tried to put the right engine not only on the left side but also upside down and backwards, my inner Mandalorian was screaming "this is NOT the way." So here is the final product.

Is it a showstopper? Not even close but, just maybe, my granddaughter learned something about patience and perseverance. And I bet she thought we were just doing a craft.
