We set a new club record for number of entries with 375 models. This is over 100 more than in previous years. He also took a poll and we had IPMS members from throughout Region 5 clubs and from several neighboring states. Thanks, Ihor for taking that small extra step.

Well that is all folks for this debrief. If this show has taught anything is that our hobby is healthy and continuing to evolve. BUT we still have things to learn.

So keep modeling and I will see you all at the December meeting.
