He thought the vendor room was good, and was not filled with just high-end items. The model entries were amazing. John then talked about how model judging was done.

Hector Colon discussed the Bases by Bill "medals" we are going to use for our Regional Show on November 2. They will be square plexiglass awards. The lower half will have the Regional Show information. That portion can be removed; therefore, we will be able to use any leftover awards for future shows. Award winners can choose between the plexiglass award or our regular medal award. He then discussed his lunch at the IPMS Show that included the IPMS presidents from the United States, Mexico, and Canada. He also mentioned the "black eye" IPMS had related to judging at the previous National Show.

Show and Tell was then held. The theme for tonight was Italy *WW II*. The model theme for the September 13 meeting is *From Your Favorite Movie*. I expect to see lots of Star Wars, Star Trek, and Marvel builds from all our club SW/ST/Marvel fan geeks!














Modellers Without Borders

As many may or may not have heard, there is a new modeling society on the scene. Modelers Without Borders (MWB) was recently launched to bring about a new society that encompasses all of the changes in our hobby over the past ten plus years. It exists to give all modelers a community where no matter what they build, auto, aircraft, armor etc. they will have a space where they will be accepted, encouraged even supported. Their mission statement:

"MWB exists to share the joy of the hobby, to foster local, national, and international communities, and to provide opportunities for modelers of all interests and abilities to develop their skills. We are a force for social good through our promotion of the hobby's social and mental health benefits and are focused on building a respectful and inclusive global modelling organization."

Now first and foremost, MWB is NOT, repeat NOT, a replacement for IPMS. It is simply another organization to assist modelers with their hobby. It is no different than AMPS or IMPS, or GTR etc. It is an autonomous and separate society from all others. It is striving to separate themselves from the rest by offering a diverse and inclusive modelling atmosphere – all are welcome. It does not matter if you build cars, planes, boats/ships, figures etc. MWB is developing a set of Exhibition and Evaluation Principles that will set evaluation standards for shows throughout the world that will scale with the creator's skill level. Junior and Beginner modelers will be rewarded more frequently than Intermediate and Advanced modellers, and it will be extremely difficult to win a Gold at the Advanced or Masters skill levels. So, a bronze medal in a Canadian show would be a bronze medal in every MWB exhibition.

Since the organization is brand new, details are a bit limited. Currently, the organization is in three countries: Australia, Canada and the United States. There are plans for exhibitions (they do not wish to use the word contest) and I believe the first one is being planned for the second half of 2025 here in the states with Canada and Australia coming some time in 2026. As described in the MWB mission statement and stated in its operating principals (see https://modellers.org/op_princ/), all types of modellers are welcome within the organization. As we all know, at our own club show, we have several categories that are either extremely lightly entered or no entries at all. MWB is going to attract the gaming miniature painters, the Gundam builders, rail roaders, those metal models that our own Dick Beemer enjoys building, etc. If you build a small representation of a larger thing, then you are welcome.

Now borders simply does not apply to just international borders, but the self-imposed borders between modelers themselves, i.e. a car modelers vs aircraft vs ship vs armor vs figure etc.

I recall when our former president, Frank Ciccarella, and I announced the addition of the Best Gaming and Best Gundam categories to our show, one BOH member stated his concern over these additions. He stated that our club is part of IPMS, and the P stands for plastic. Well, that is the basis of this new organization. Is our hobby strictly "plastic" anymore? Today, I question the

amount of plastic in any model on any table. As a painter of gaming miniatures, the last several squads of Warhammer Blood Angels were all completely plastic. However, the 1970 Ford Mustang that is currently on my work bench will have a 3D-printed resin engine. At the recent national convention, how much actual "plastic" was part of any of the entries on the tables? If my memory serves me correctly, the Best in Show winner was completely 3D printed.

Over the last decade or so, the hobby of scale model building has experienced a huge renaissance and evolution. MWB was formed to fill the hole brought on by 3D printing, resin and photo-etch. We no longer are limited to one or two choices of paint brands. We now have access to resin cockpits, white metal landing gear, metal tracks for tanks and more decals than you can possibly use. At the recent IPMS National Convention, the vendor room was full of aftermarket detail kits made of resin, white metal even 3D printed. I for one found the Eduard area almost too hard to resist.

So if you want to check out the new organization, check out their page on Facebook or their website www.modellers.org where you can register to receive updates as to structure, by laws etc.

So, until I see you at the next meeting, Keep Modelling.
